

#### **REPORT ON SMHA SURVEY 2018**

The Management Team decided to Survey members of SMHA to ascertain whether the services being provided met their needs; find out what new or different things could be done; ascertain if any members felt able to contribute to the work of the Team and, of course (covered in question 1) check that the information held was correct.

The Survey went live in March 2018 and was open until mid-May with various reminders going out to members. We were delighted with the response rate which was exactly 20% of those Surveyed (we did not send the request to small groups, i.e. Governors, those with no internet access) and with the number of members who not only answered the 'multiple choice' questions but offered most helpful and constructive feedback.

The Team Manager (Penny Harrison) has emailed almost every member who offered feedback or comments where 'answers' were helpful or needed. She is more than happy to engage further with any member reading this report who has comments to add, regardless of whether the member completed the original Survey.

The questions (and responses) follow, with Team feedback (discussed and agreed by the Team at a meeting in June) and concluding remarks at the end of the report.





## Team comments on what the feedback to "Reunion" questions has given us to take forward:

We are unable to change geography but can support virtual or real reunions in different countries and would be happy to do this. Also outside our control also are answers such as:" busy with family, distance, work etc." and sadly also "age/infirmity/difficulties in travelling" although we can (and have on more than one occasion) put members together for lifts.


10% are not interested in reunions. 30% stated that reunions in the Brighton area were too far for them to travel. 32% asked for reunions in country/region/locality and 62% asked for reunions specific to year group/age. The Team should perhaps consider how to promote to members that use of the database to identify those in the same year or location and then emailing them proactively would stimulate reunions which are clearly wanted - we can offer support but unless individuals wish to lead then these will not happen. 36% stated they would like an opportunity to tour the school grounds/buildings and it is something to bear in mind although not something which is likely to be able to be arranged at this time.



## Team comments on what the feedback has given us to take forward:

Although a tiny number attended, the Carol Service generated a high number of comments with 24% having 'something to say'! Outside the Team's control are issues such as members who live abroad; sing in other choirs; have commitments at this time of year; 'don't sing'; or are in general too busy. **Publicity** – despite widespread publicity through all our media in 2017 various factors such as weather obviously affected attendance and awareness was high with only 7% stating they were not aware of the event. However, this year we will be doing more to ensure that especially those who live in the BN catchment are kept well in the loop about it.

Car parking in Kemptown/Brighton will always be problematical and again is outside our control. However we are intending to remind members that they can get four hours free in Marina and could arrange to meet there, then one car with 'fittest' driver ferry five/six up to church and back OR all of you split cost of parking that one car nearer...in other words, ladies, organise yourselves as you were taught to!

**Wheelchair accessibility** – we have sourced the number to call (01273 698601) in advance if there are any access concerns.

The choice of venue - One member replied further, about looking for a church "in the sticks". We take the point about parking but query the connection with the School. When the Team originally scoped this out (as soon as we launched in this form we were asked whether we could/would organize one) we frankly never considered approaching one with no school connection! St Marks' — no longer a church; St George's and St Mary's (historical link with HVE) approached at same time. St Mary's 'oh, lovely we would be so pleased to have you'; St G's either belated or no reply. St Mary's is an amazingly warm and welcoming place with so many meetings and services — and loads of music — which fits in with the ethos of the school that this Team would not currently consider looking elsewhere.

The welcome by St Mary's - It unfortunate, since Fr Andrew had notes of special welcome, that he forgot several individual welcomes. The local MP was terribly late and Fr A was distracted by worrying about how to sort out lesson reading should said MP fail altogether. He has already said that he will not omit this in 2018.

**The welcome by SMHA** – Sian, dressed in "SMH" colours, stood at the entrance to welcome each of the SMH girls who attended. She will be doing this again in 2018.

**The after-party** – Sian had arranged a choice of venues for members to go on to afterwards but no one took up this offer. However it will be replicated this year. For this, and indeed regarding feeling 'welcome' if you attend, <u>please</u> make yourself known to Sian!

In other feedback on the service was that one member felt isolated and another felt she was warmly welcomed by all church members to whom she spoke...but as in all social gatherings, if you stay with one person, or a small group you know, you're unlikely to be integrated too much. We all hope for a better turn out (better weather would help!) in 2018 also that more who come will take up the suggestion in place this year to "go on somewhere".

**In summary**, it was disappointing that arrangements which were in place were criticised for not being available (e.g. "I would have appreciated it if someone had organised a follow-on event" since we publicised very widely that the opportunity to 'go on' had been arranged.)

Hopefully even more publicity in 2018 will address this, also offer it to the 20% who said they would consider attending if they could meet up afterwards. 16% said they hoped to attend on 16th December 2018 and we can only hope this translates into actual attendance.



## Team comments on what the feedback has given us to take forward:


An amazingly gratifying 76% answered that they look forward to receiving this and catching up with news of friends. Only 3.8% dislike the present format and would prefer to have it either added to the website or sent within an email. 10% admitted not to reading it often with a further 4% not checking emails regularly to see if there was one to read. 2% could not remember receiving one. One member stated "I wish there was a way I could opt out of receiving this" and we have followed this up with an offer to remove them from the mailing list. Most issues raised in "other comments" have been addressed individually with members. There is a shift in the summer issue to move to fewer words and more links, while keeping words for those who prefer (a balancing act). Hopefully the Team is only caretaking this pending a much needed volunteer to edit the quarterly e-newsletter.







## Team comments on what the feedback to all VCR questions has given us to take forward:


The survey's accuracy is well evidenced here with 33% stating they do not belong to the VCR and 35% saying they do. This is almost exactly as per the 960 total members (893 Old Girls) versus 529 VCR membership. Less than 15% responded that they used the internet but not the VCR which also suggests we have almost reached capacity on targeting for new members of the Group. Less than 3% stated that having joined the VCR they had not been back and this is encouraging. However, only 2% state they would regularly post anything they think may be of interest. Two other comments had responders: "I wish someone would explain how I can be notified when someone I know posts here" and "I didn't know we could upload files/photos" My thought is that Lis should compile a short guide to using the Group to answer these three issues and encourage more posts/photos.



#### **Team comments:**

Much as expected there is no clear 'work area' for our members – the spread is even across the lower percentages of legal/accountancy/banking/journalism/linguistics etc.. While it informs us (or confirms our previous beliefs) it gives no clear indication on a direction to take the Assn. other than that we should continue to cater for a wide range of interests.

**Finally**, we asked for any member who felt she might be able to assist the team to give us her details. Three members responded and each was contacted.

Two have since withdrawn their offer for the present while indicating they may be able to assist in the future. One has not yet responded.

#### **Conclusion**:

Team members have put an enormous amount of work into compiling what we hoped were the right questions to ask you, publicising the Survey so that members would want to complete it, reading and responding to each comment you made and then compiling the whole into this report. Hopefully not only the 20% of members who completed the survey but many other members will access this report and find it of interest.

We welcome your comments and feedback at any time about anything, but in particular in reference to the work we undertake and whether there are things you would like done differently. For the present we intend to focus on supporting individuals or groups who wish to organise reunions, large or small, in Brighton or elsewhere, lunches, coffees, dinners or holidays, and to actively seek news and photos of these.

We will be continuing to network with active members and seek out new ones, using social media, email, and of course word of mouth from the 960+ of you already reconnected with your Association.

We plan to support and grow the Carol Service for as long as numbers attending it confirm that it is wanted and enjoyed and to offer our assistance in any activity a member brings to us as a project. The focus of our work will remain "virtual" given the spread of our members — one theme running through the survey which confirms the data we hold on you is that distance prevents 90% of us from

attending 'real' events held in any one venue but that with the exception of 11 members not connected to the internet every one of us can network in the e-world!

Thank you for participating, those who did; and thank you to everyone for reading the report.
